## Lake Manager's Report


- Apr-May activities
  - Debris is accumulating at the back of Mokins' Bay; will extend the close date for D/D removal program to June 8
  - Working on removing old floating wetlands
- Other watershed issues no worrisome construction

### **Communication & Public Outreach Manager's Report**

• Communication updates – communication re Wake Ordinance primary activity, collecting and forwarding BLOG comments to CCs; developed remove-illegal-buoys postcard.

### **HLWAI Updates**

- Honey Badger submitted letter on the 30<sup>th</sup>; identified an alternative route the FS437 and Ohio Match road over Hayden Creek.
- Wake ordinance jointly funded add in support of Wake Ordinance; issued an online petition in support; wrote "My Turn" for CdA Press; will testify at public hearing
- Buoys postcards in mail to encourage illegal buoy removal
- North Arm Virtual Meeting topics: limnology of North Arm, weed treatment, solution



#### **Old Business**

- Buoy permitting, purchase, installation:
  - Purchase of buoys on hold until approved number is determined, and status of illegal buoys is understood.
  - Per Nancy Strickland, representing the HLWID insurance carrier, the HLWID is not extremely vulnerable to litigation regarding removal of illegal buoys. Recommended that we get authorization in writing from IDL to remove illegal buoys including lifting and cutting the cable s.t. the anchor remains on the bottom of the lake; mark lat/long of removed buoy.
  - Buoy-permitting fyi, IDL will not permit buoys to individuals; Nick Snyder (KC P&W) possibly wishes to remain involved in future decisions; KCSO must enforce them. The enforcement piece leads to involvement on the CCs part.
- 2020-2021 Budget hearing June 15 Budget for '20-'21 is approved as of May 18<sup>th</sup>; LN moved;
  SM 2<sup>nd</sup>; all approved.
- Research studies GH reported Southshore data complete and no new conclusions; no reply from D Brandt.
- Leo delivered no-wake-zone ordinance signs: large to City of Hayden for Honeysuckle, one up at HL Country Club, four up at Hayden Marina one at each gated entrance to docks, two up at both kiosks at Sportsman's, one remaining for the Falls, to be installed in the tram or at the top of the tram.
- Discussion w KC Planning regarding whether HLWID can consult on HL-related permitting opportunities:
  - TW attempted to contact Sandy Young for historical insight; no response
  - SW will review law establishing the HLWID and will continue conversation w/ D Callahan regarding HLWID-consulting issue and will ask again about regulation enforcement
