- May-June activities
 - Dock/Debris Removal Program wrap-up removal started the week of the 15th; should be completed by 22nd; may be 10+ items removed
 - GH requested we change the term "permit" to "authorization" or "permission slip"
- AmTest results should be going to Daren; Todd will get them for this year for GH.

Communication & Public Outreach Manager's Report

• Communication updates – reminder sent to D/D disposal permit holders;

HLWAI Updates:

- North Arm educational meeting was successful check out the video on the Association website.
- planning support for the Honeysuckle Bay no-wake-zone.
- Documenting impact of excessive wakes developing online form for residents to use to report observations; will locate cameras and triggering systems to capture video of wake impacts;
- Invited members of the HLWID Board to participate in a Watershed tour in July.
- Considering Annual Meeting early August, possible outside venue.

Old Business

- Might HLWID hire an enforcement officer?
 - KCSO's Marine Division has 8 deputies/4 teams for the '20 season; one team will cover Hayden Lake plus four other lakes in the county; no back-filling to replace lost deputies can take place; partnership discussions can ensue in late summer, early fall to ensure proper staffing for the '21 season.
 - Hayden will most likely not have a marine deputy team regularly assigned on M-W, will have a team occasionally on Th and regularly partial days F-Su.
- Buoy permitting, purchase, installation
 - LN spoke with Merlin, all parts ordered, parts trickling in; will coordinate with T Frye for assembly
 - SM confirmed Bill Brooks' support for 14 buoys, will pursue Chris Fillios' support. JW had previously discussed with Leslie Duncan who declines support.
 - WK marine deputies are trained in distance estimation; buoys are beneficial for public education; acknowledged that 14 buoys would make navigation on Hayden Lake safer; Sheriff presence on the water is equally important for compliance and improved safety.
 - TW noted that the 10 buoys permitted (7 currently in-situ) along the shoreline from Honeysuckle to Bervin's Bay, having never been perceived as "too many," are an important precedent to bring to the CC's attention.
- HLWID consulting on relevant construction permits and County enforcement of construction permitting ordinances – will postpone this discussion until buoy issues are resolved.
 - From 5/18/20 SM will review HWLID-establishing law, will continue conversation w/ D Callahan on HLWID-consulting potential, and will ask again about regulation enforcement
