Lake Manager's Report

- June-July activities
 - o From 6/19/21 TW follow up on tree clearing above O'Rourke Bay done Steeply-sloped site, >50 yd^3 dirt removal, dirt is sliding into the SMA and has high

- potential to erode into lake; currently not permitted but site-disturbance permit required; C Davis from KC Planning will follow-up.
- From 6/19/21 TW investigate tree felling on Evernade Point done
 Trees removed in excess of SMA regulation; sent video and image to C Davidson, KC
 Planning; follow-up expected.
- Honeysuckle Bay buoy installation complete. Nick Snyder awaiting the MOU amendment addition of Honeysuckle Bay buoys; requested diagram of the buoy assembly.
- Moving debris from Lake Debris Cleanup Program TW and Gil Rossner moved the most dangerous materials away from the road and toward the camp. Debris remaining near the road is high and dry. No debris removed this year because of Highway Dept chip-sealing. Next year, coordinate with the Highway Dept when preparing for debris removal.
- Mokins bay behind the dike is drying, mud cracking.

- Shoreline Management Public Education discussion:
 - Use O'Rourke un-permitted construction and SM's shoreline armoring as case-studies
 - o Target audience contractor, property owners, neighbors, commissioners
 - Objective stimulating regulatory action on all stakeholders' parts
 - Message property development without measures to prevent environmental impacts nets a continuous wearing away of lake water quality; we're not advocating new rules, rather adherence to existing rules.
- FSR437 video discussion
 - Objective: support Association's efforts to motivate public support for FSR437
 amendment and thereby reduce sedimentation and possible contamination from
 Hayden Creek into Hayden Lake; convey Improvement District message that Hayden
 Creek contributes to Hayden Lake's water quality in potentially negative ways via
 sedimentation and possible contamination.
 - Cost TBD, estimated < \$10K
 - o will be shown at Association Annual Meeting
- Honey Badger Community Awareness Poster discussion
 - From 6/21/21 MAS HLWID poster of Honey Badger cut plans in the lobby of the country club and revise BLOG post - in-progress;
 add QR code linking to FS published plan.
 - o represent only the viewshed issue in the poster
 - o objective: awareness on part of residents; manage their expectations
 - call to action: contact FS with interest in modifying impact, softening impact (provide language for response), read about it (QR code), share expertise w/ Association's negotiation w FS;
 - possible requests soften the margins, spread the work out in time, alternatives (stand-replacing fire)
- Weed treatment update EWM treatment in the main body of the lake starting the week of July 19; North Arm treatment dates not set, TBA July 20.

 - Criteria for new buoy placement? This year's activity should inform future placement
 - What information from wake incident reporting will help decision-making re new buoy placement?

 - HLWID Board will host a workshop to discuss lake planning history and the following questions:
 - How does the board identify threats to water quality and how do we assign threat levels? - KR
 - How do we prioritize where we take action and where we delay or defer? KR
 - What are the current priorities and are we accountable to a plan? KR
 - Is the impact of our actions measurable? KR
- Review MOU amendment proposed by KCP&W KR moves to approve the proposal based on the changes only being the increase from 14 to 17 buoys; LN 2nd; all approved.
